1. BACKGROUND

The South African Judiciary is committed to promoting a safe, respectful, and inclusive working environment that upholds constitutional values, judicial integrity, and the dignity of all individuals. The prescripts on judicial conduct require Judges and Magistrates to act honourably. The Chief Justice issued a Sexual Harassment policy for the Judiciary on 9 August 2025. The policy reaffirmed the core values of the judiciary, namely: integrity, accountability, equality, dignity and respect.

In terms of clause14 of the policy, there should be capacity building of the members of the judiciary in the form of awareness sessions and online seminars.

In line with its mandate, the South African Judicial Education Institute (SAJEI) seeks to appoint a suitably qualified service provider to design, develop and implement an interactive and comprehensive online anti-sexual harassment course for the judiciary in compliance with the Sexual Harassment Policy.

The South African Judicial Education Institute has a learning management system developed on Moodle, the required online course should be compatible with Moodle version 4.2.

2. OBJECTIVES

The South African Judicial Education Institute (SAJEI) would like to appoint a service to convert the Sexual Harassment Policy for the Judiciary of South Africa into an online course

- 1. Design the **curriculum and course content**, covering but not limited to:
 - o Introduction to sexual harassment and the legal framework.
 - o Overview of the Judiciary's Sexual Harassment policy.
 - Rights and responsibilities of judicial officers.
 - Reporting mechanisms, support systems, and disciplinary procedures.
 - Case studies, role plays, and ethical dilemmas.
 - Reflection and assessment modules.

- 2. Develop **interactive e-learning materials**, including:
 - Multimedia (videos, animations, voiceovers).
 - Infographics and downloadable resources.
 - o Quizzes, knowledge checks, and final assessments
- 3. Ensure the course is user-friendly, mobile-compatible, and integrates into SAJEI's Learning Management System (LMS).
- 4. Pilot the course with a selected group of judicial officers, and revise based on feedback.
- 5. Deliver the **final online course package** (SCORM/xAPI) and provide training to SAJEI officials on course administration.
- 6. If any errors are found in the activities, the service provider shall correct them at no cost to the Office of the Chief Justice.

3. ACCREDITATION

- 1. The Bidder must provide CVs of project team
 - a) Instructional designer (must have at least 3 years' experience in creating learning experiences, developing online courses and training programs.
 Minimum NQF level 6 in Education, Instructional Design, Educational Technology, Information Technology)
 - b) Multimedia specialist (must have at least 3 years' experience in creating digital content. Minimum NQF level 5 in Graphic Design, UX Design, or related field)
 - c) Gender equality specialist (must have at least 5 years' experience in consulting and training in gender-sensitive strategies and policies. Minimum NQF level 7 in social science especially gender studies, Psychology or relevant discipline)
- 2. Bidders are required to submit the consent letter / form signed by the resource whose CV is submitted and dated after the tender publication date

4. FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS

Interested service providers are invited to submit:

- 1. A detailed technical proposal outlining their approach, methodology, and timelines.
- 2. Company profile with relevant experience in e-learning design and development, preferably in the public sector with minimum of three (3) years.

- 3. CVs of team members to be involved in the project (Instructional designer, Multimedia specialist, gender equality specialist)
- 4. Three contactable references of similar work done by the company
- 5. Samples of previous online training projects developed.

5. DELIVERABLES

The Service Provider is expected to convert the Sexual Harassment Policy for the Judiciary of South Africa into an online course. The service provider is expected to produce:

- An **inception report** with methodology, proposed outline of the online course, work plan with timelines, resource persons.
- Draft outline of **online anti-sexual harassment course** for review.
- Pilot the course with a selected group of judicial officers, and revise based on feedback.
- Final comprehensive and interactive online course package (SCORM/xAPI).
- Induction of SAJEI officials.
- The intellectual property Of all material produced and delivered by the service provider as part of the scope of this RFQ will belong to OCJ.

6. EVALUATION AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The OCJ has set minimum standards known as gates, which are minimum standards that bidders need to meet in order to be evaluated and selected as a successful bidder. The minimum standards consist of the following **Table 1**:
