Business Case for Change / Pain Points

Case Registration

- Need to physically travel to and make an appearance at court to just receive a case number
- Case registration is a manual process with large number of cases being archaically captured in the court book.
- Large queues prevalent at the courts for case registrations.

Pre-Hearing Proceedings

- Manual scheduling of court dates
- Manual assignment of Judges to cases
- Security of court files is low
- Large quantity of corruption and theft of court documents
- Duplicate date applications are a possibility leading to two court date entries
- Physical appearance at the court required in order to apply for a court date entries
- Manual court roll creation
- Manual notification of court date to parties
- Court susceptible to court roll manipulation by attorneys

Business Case for Change / Pain Points

Pleadings

- Large number of physical documents are filed
- Long waiting time for court orders being typed
- Fraudulent court orders
- Various court files are stolen / lost and are missing

Hearing Proceedings

- Various court files are stolen, lost, or missing.
- Physical tracking of documents and files.
- Lack of visibility of who has made changes to court files.
- Long waiting time of draft orders being typed.
- Shortage of physical document storage space.
- Fraudulent court orders.
- Court scanners not working.
- Public access to court documents requires physical appearance at the relevant court.

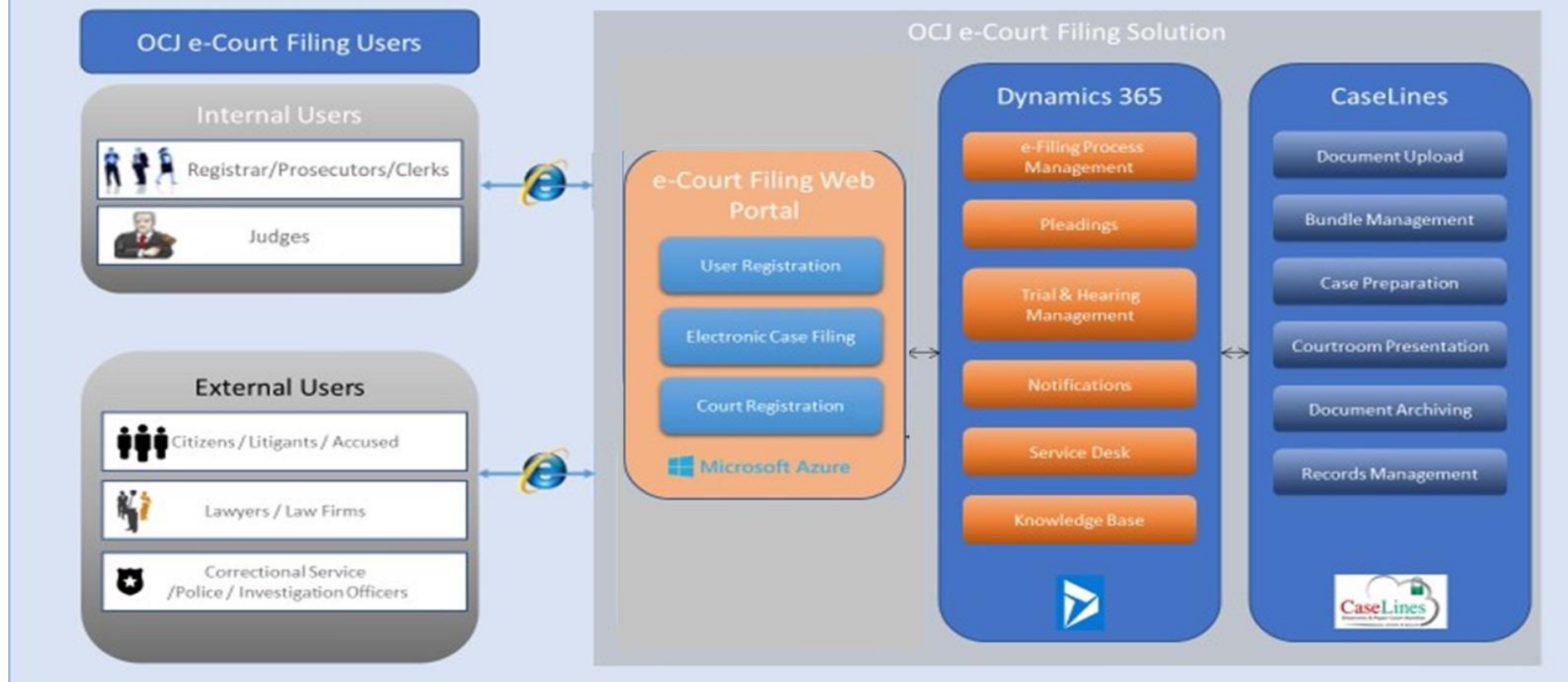

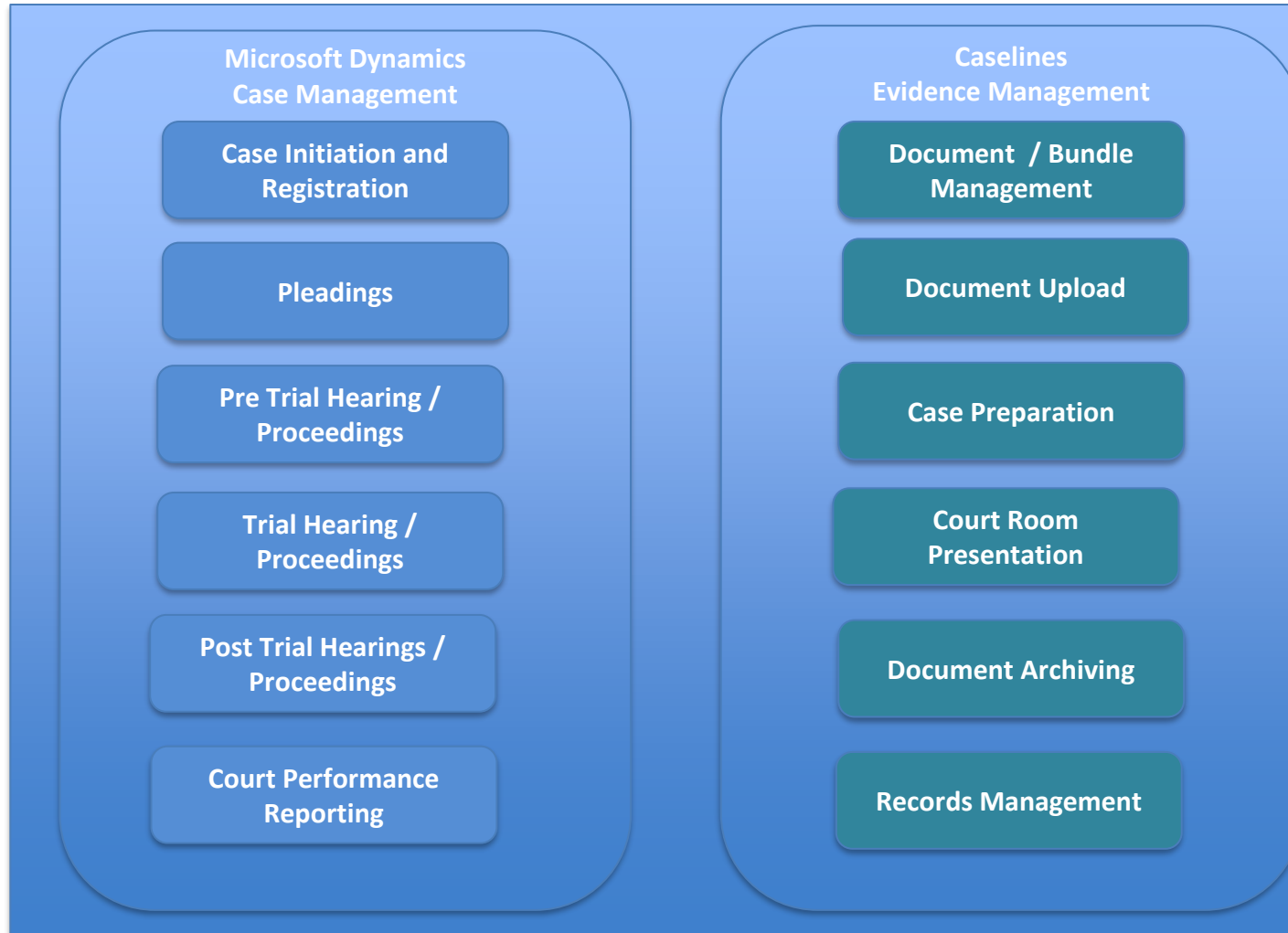
