16 (1) and (2) read with 31(2)	Failure to remain confined to his/her place of residence, unless strictly for the purpose of: (a) performing an essential service or permitted service, (b) going to work where a permit has been issued, (c) buying permitted goods, (d) obtaining that are allowed to operate in Table 1 to the Regulations; (e) conveying/moving as allowed children;	R3000.00 (Three Thousand Rand)

	(f) walking, running or cycling between the hours of 06h00 to 09h00, within a five kilometre radius of their place of residence	
16 (3) read with 31(2)	Failure to confine to his/her residence from 20H00 until 05H00 daily except where a person has been granted a permit to perform an essential or permitted service as listed in Annexure D,or is attending to a security or medical emergency	R3000.00 (Three Thousand Rand)
16 (4)	Moving between provinces, metropolitan areas and district except for; (a) for workers who have a permit to perform an essential or permitted service who have to commute to and from work on a daily basis; (b) attendance of a	R4000.00 (Four Thousand Rand)

mortal remains and for	
learners who have to
