Regulation 14(5) read with 5(2)(a) Being a driver or operator of public transport and fails to take reasonable steps to ensure that a person uses, operates or performs any service on any such public transport, whilst not wearing a cloth face mask, homemade item, or another appropriate item that covers his/her nose and mouth.
