1. FIRST CALL FOR PAPERS JUNE 2017

The Editorial Board of the South African Judicial Education Journal (SAJEJ) invites submission of articles for a first issue. The theme for the first issue is judicial education. SAJEJ is a high quality peer reviewed journal that is published under the auspices of the South African Judicial Education Institute. The journal provides a platform for the Judiciary, legal practitioners, legal researchers, academics and post-graduate students to impart and share empirical, practical and theoretical research through the publishing of articles, case notes and book reviews.

The following sub-themes are guidelines for the submission of the articles:

- a. Evolution of judicial education in South Africa;
- b. The link between judicial education and judicial functions;
- c. The tenets of judicial education: African and International perspectives; and
- d. Analysis of judicial education models in African countries.

2. SUBMISSION OF ARTICLES

2.1 All submissions should be made online to SAJEJournal@judiciary.org.za

2.2 The requirements for submission are as follows:

- 2.2.1 A title that is aligned to the theme of judicial education;
- 2.2.2 Details of the author/s: title, name, institutional affiliation, email address, postal address and telephone number;
- 2.2.3 An abstract of not more than 300 words;
- 2.2.4 An article with a minimum of 3000 to a maximum of 5000 words including footnotes;
- 2.2.5 The format of the article is 1.5 spacing, font Arial 11, justify and in MS Word;

2.2.6 Articles must be original in content. Any idea or quotation from another source must be fully acknowledged.
