The Editorial Board welcomes original manuscript submission written in English. The articles should be between 3000 and 5000 words in length including footnotes. All articles should have an abstract of not more than 300 words. The format of the article should be 1.5 spacing, font Arial 11, justify and in MS Word.

All submissions should be made online to <u>SAJEJournal@judiciary.org.za.</u> Articles must be original in content. Any idea or quotation from another source must be fully acknowledged. All articles will be checked for originality using Turnitin software. The article must have the title aligned to the theme. Details of the author/s: title, name, institutional affiliation, email address, postal address and telephone number should be included.
