

The Chief Justice of the Republic of South Africa, Justice Mandisa Maya, has, in consultation with Heads of Court, determined that this year's Judiciary Day will be held on 24 October 2025. The day will be marked by the presentation of the Judiciary's Annual Reports for the 2023/24 and 2024/25 Financial Years to the public. The event will be held virtually and livestreamed to the public.

The Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, provides that the Judiciary is independent and subject only to the Constitution and the law. The Chief Justice is the Head of the Judiciary and exercises responsibility over the establishment and monitoring of the Norms and Standards for the exercise of judicial functions of all Courts. The South African Judiciary holds the Judiciary Day to present its Annual Report on Judicial Functions and Court Performance.
