Estimated duration: The initial estimated duration of 05 days has been reassessed by the parties and adapted to 14 days (*the parties were directed to remove the matter from the roll; a trial date of 12 August 2024 has been granted to the parties*). Plaintiff made three protected disclosures to her employer, the 1st defendant on: - 26 June 2018 (Phabema); - 01 August 2018 (Stock written off); and - 19 September 2018 and 20 September 2018. As a result of her making the protected disclosures, the 1st defendant subjected her to a disciplinary hearing, and she suffered occupational detriment. Subsequently, she was unlawfully dismissed by the 1st defendant. She is claiming damages in five claims. The defendants contend that: - The plaintiff should have instituted proceedings in the Labour Court but sought to circumvent it by relying on purported protected disclosures, which from the subject of the two special pleas. - The plaintiff was not subjected to an occupational detriment; - The plaintiff was lawfully dismissed following a disciplinary hearing;

- The plaintiff allegedly made the protected disclosures to circumvent the disciplinary process;
- The plaintiff did not make protected disclosures and if the Court finds that she made protected disclosures, then the protected disclosures are not in accordance with the Act.
- The plaintiff is not entitled to the relief she seeks

Issues for determination:

- Whether the Court has jurisdiction adjudicate the plaintiff's claim 1 and claim 2 in respect of which the defendants have filed special pleas. The merits of the special pleas are intertwined with the merits in the plaintiff's action and should not be heard separately.
- Whether the plaintiff is a whistle-blower defined by the Protected Disclosures Act;
- Whether the protected disclosures allegedly made by the plaintiff comply with the Act;
- Whether the plaintiff suffered an occupational detriment as defined in the Act;
- Whether the defendant unlawfully terminated the plaintiff's employment;
- Whether the plaintiff is entitled to the relief sought in claims 3 and 4;
- What the plaintiff's quantum will be if successful
