RE: Chief Justice to speak at Unisa on 20 years of judicial transformation

Is the South African judiciary sufficiently transformed after 20 years of democracy? What has been some of the transformation challenges and milestones in the judiciary's transformation journey during this period? What challenges remain and what plans are in place to take the transformation of the judiciary to a new level?

These and other questions will be answered by the Chief Justice of the Republic of South Africa, Justice Mogoeng Mogoeng when he delivers the keynote address at the Unisa Principal and Vice Chancellor's gala dinner to be held at the university's main campus on Tuesday, 25 November 2014.

He will speak on the theme: 'Reflections on the South African Judiciary: 20 years of judicial transformation efforts'.
