

3. LEGISLATIVE AND OTHER MANDATES

In discharging its mandate, SAJEI is guided by the Constitution, the South African Judicial Education Institute Act (SAJEI Act 14 of 2008), as amended by the Judicial Matters Amendment Act, Act 24 of 2015 and other relevant legislation and policies.

The Constitutional mandate of SAJEI emanates from section 180(a) of the Constitution which makes provision for national legislation to be promulgated dealing with the training of Judicial Officers.

The SAJEI Act is the basis for the legislative mandate of the Institute. The Act establishes the institute and provides for its mandate.

The compulsory training of newly appointed Magistrates is provided for in section 3(1)(f)(i) of the Magistrates Court Act. The section provides that: "No person shall be appointed as Magistrates, unless he/she has successfully completed an applicable course."

6. OVERVIEW OF SAJEI'S PERFORMANCE

This report provides progress on the implementation of the 2020/21 Annual Training schedules for the Judicial Officers, as well as the Annual Research Agenda, and support provided to foreign Judicial Institutions as provided for in the SAJEI Act. During this reporting period, the annual target for Judicial Education courses was 100. A total of 123 webinars were conducted from 1 April, 2020 to 31 March, 2021 attended by 3 297 Judicial Officers. SAJEI exceeded the target due to ad-hoc requests for additional training in response to the needs from the leadership of the Judiciary.

Due to the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020, the workshops planned for April and May 2020 were cancelled. As a result, face-to-face training was replaced with webinars from June 2020. The webinars were conducted through two platforms namely: Microsoft Teams and Zoom. Capacity development initiatives were conducted for Judicial Educators, Facilitators, and SAJEI support officials on the implementation of virtual training.

The training of District Court Magistrates covered, among others, four (4) streams, namely: Civil Court skills, Children's Court skills, Criminal Court skills and Family Court skills. The training entailed mostly practical components in order to contribute towards Judicial Court performance. For example, mock trials were conducted during Civil Court skills, as reflected in the picture below:

In 2018, SAJEI launched an annual Human Rights Programme where a number of pertinent rights issues were discussed. Examples of such topics included are LGBTQI+, Gender-Based Violence, HIV/TB and Aids, Sexual Offences, Social and Economic Rights, Homelessness and others.



A number of crucial issues were discussed during the 2020 Human Rights Week.


Two webinars took place in June 2020 for Regional Court Magistrates and members of the Judiciary from foreign institutions. One of the webinars was on managing judicial training in new normal times in order to share experiences, and build capacity. The webinar was organised in partnership with the National Centre for State Courts in USA. Other training initiatives focused on gender-based violence and stereotyping, evictions, trafficking in persons, sexual offences, PEPUDA, the Small Claims Court, child pornography, PAIA and PAJA.

One of the responsibilities of SAJEI is to contribute to a transformational Judiciary through education and training. In order to achieve this objective, SAJEI has conducted training for aspiring women judges in March 2021. The training was attended by 38 delegates drawn from the Lower Court Judiciary and members of the legal profession. The training focused on judicial ethics, managing opposed and unopposed motions, managing criminal trials, judgment writing, as well as appeals and reviews.

Three (3) webinars were conducted in support to foreign judicial institutions. They were on: trafficking in persons and electoral justice. SAJEI also invited international partners to participate in the webinars. In attendance were members of the judiciary from Botswana, Cameroon, Malawi, Mozambique, Lesotho, Namibia, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe, as well as international delegates from Nevada (USA), Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Puerto Rico and Singapore.




A dry run was held for the Electoral Justice Webinar in October, 2020.

Most of the training materials developed and reviewed during this financial year were in response to the impact of the Disaster Management Act 57 of 2002, and Covid-19 pandemic alert levels, as reflected in the list below.

The research projects for this reporting period included three (3) SAJEI Newsletters, one (1) journal and two (2) monographs. There was a special edition Newsletter on Covid-19 pandemic issues.

One of the responsibilities of the institute as stated in the Act, is to "liaise with other judicial education institutions in connection with performance of its functions". In order to improve and refine services rendered by SAJEI, there were consultations with other judicial training institutions around the world for the exchange of best practices. During this reporting period the SAJEI sub-committee of Curriculum Planning and Development engaged with the Singapore Judicial College to, among others, determine an appropriate model for the placement of Judicial Educators at the Institute.

6.3 RESEARCH PROJECTS

One of the functions of SAJEI is to conduct Judicial Education research. SAJEI developed the annual research agenda consisting of a number of activities, including Newsletter, Journal and Monograph.

6.3.1 SAJEI NEWSLETTER

SAJEI published three newsletters during this reporting period. One issue was a special edition dealing with Covid-19 pandemic issues. The articles covered regulating permits during the pandemic, technology and Covid-19, as well as hearing divorce cases in the Regional Courts during the pandemic.

6.3.2 SAJEI JOURNAL

SAJEI published Volume 3 of the SAJEI Journal in December 2020.

6.3.3 SAJEI MONOGRAPH

SAJEI produced two monographs during this reporting period.
